CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

Articles are sought for the journal's next issue. Your scholarly papers on any subject related to the Iroquois are most welcome. Disciplines such as history, anthropology, archaeology, linguistics, art, literature, ecology, political science, and education may be appropriate formats for articles. This is a peer-reviewed publication. Your article will be sent to three anonymous peer reviewers. Please allow time for their thoughtful responses.

SPECIFICATIONS

1. Articles must be in Microsoft Word .docx format.
Times-Roman font, 12 pt., double-spaced.
Margins 1" on all sides.
2. Cite in either 1)notes and bibliography or 2)author-date style using guidelines from the print edition of *The Chicago Manual of Style*, by University of Chicago Press,
Or, alternately, use the online version Chicago-Style Citation Quick Guide.

Notes should appear at the end of the paper, *not* at the bottom of every page.
3. Quotations must appear in double quotation marks (""). Quotations longer than three sentences should be in a quote paragraph form: indented, single-spaced, and one point smaller font. Do not use quotation marks with quote paragraphs. For quotes within quotes, use single quote marks (').
4. Names of Indian Nations should be plural for groups, as in "The Mohawks live there."
The word indigenous shall not be capitalized, nor shall be native, as in native person. If used as a proper name, as in Native American, the capital is used.
5. Proper national names should be used to define all groups and racial names avoided. Use English, French, Dutch, Canadian, or American in lieu of "whites."
6. The United States may be shortened to U.S., not US.
7. Use American spelling forms, not Canadian or English.
8. If you include personal asides such as acknowledgements, or remarks related to colleagues or process, group them in a note at the end. They will *not* be sent to peer-reviewers.
9. If you have images that improve your article, include high quality digital files. Make a note of where they should be placed, and provide them with figure numbers and captions.
